Library & Archives building, which is on the National Park Service National Underground Railroad Network. It was dedicated on September 25.

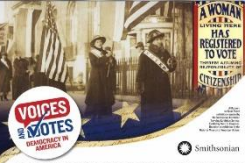
Held Harrods Creek Slave Cemetery Dinner Walk & Talk

Included dinner, presentation by Morris Mount Roberts Fellow Robert Bell, and then a walk to Harrods Creek slave cemetery with over 20 unmarked graves of enslaved people from Oldham County.



Hosted Smithsonian Exhibit – Voices and Votes
